

Types of Pronouns

- **Personal Pronouns**

This kind of pronoun is used to talk about certain people or groups.

E.g. He, She, They, You, We

- **Reflexive Pronouns**

These words point to who or what is doing something in a sentence.

E.g. Ourselves, Itself, Myself

- **Interrogative Pronouns**

They are used to ask questions and gather information.

E.g. Which, Who, Whom

- **Reciprocal Pronouns**

These words help us talk about things that people do together.

E.g. Each other.

- **Possessive Pronouns**

This kind of pronoun tells us who owns or has something.

E.g. Its, ours, His, yours

- **Demonstrative Pronouns**

These words show exactly what we mean by pointing to specific things or ideas.

E.g. That, This, Those

- **Indefinite Pronouns**

They are use to refer to non-specific things, or ideas

E.g. Someone, Anybody.

- **Intensive Pronouns**

They are used to add emphasis to a noun or pronoun in a sentence.

E.g. Myself, Yourself.
